Objectives:



Specifically, the report aims to evaluate alumni opinions on curriculum relevance, teaching faculty quality, learning resources availability, teaching methodologies effectiveness, practical learning opportunities, career preparedness, placement and career guidance services, student counseling, extracurricular activities, and alumni relations and engagement.

Methodology:


The feedback was collected through an online mode using google form, leveraging alumni networks and communication platforms. A structured survey was distributed to gather quantitative data on various aspects of the college experience. The survey included Likert-scale questions to measure alumni perceptions, providing insights into their satisfaction levels across different categories. Additionally, qualitative feedback was solicited through openended questions, allowing alumni to express specific concerns or suggestions.

Analysis of the feedback.

1. Curriculum relevance to industry needs: 24.1% alumni rated it as Excellent, 44.8% as Good, 6.9% as Satisfactory, and 24.1% as Needs Improvement.



2. Quality of teaching faculty: 27.9% rated it as Excellent, 41.4% as Good, and 20.7% as Satisfactory.



- 3. Availability of learning resources: 37.9% rated it as Excellent, 48.3% as Good.
- 4. Effectiveness of teaching methodologies: 27.6% rated it as Excellent, 55.2% as Good.
- 5. Opportunities for practical learning and skill development: 27.6% rated it as Excellent,
- 31% as Good, 13.8% as Satisfactory, and 27.6% as Needs Improvement.
- 6. Curriculum preparedness for chosen career path: 72.4% rated it as Excellent, 27.6% as Good.
- 7. Placement cell and career guidance: 20.7% rated it as Excellent, 44.8% as Good.
- 8. Student counseling services: 20.7% rated it as Excellent, 44.8% as Good.

- 9. Extracurricular activities and Student Forums: 51.7% rated it as Excellent, 34.5% as Good, and 13.8% as Satisfactory.
- 10. Alumni relations and engagement: 20.7% rated it as Excellent, 34.5% as Good, and 31% as Satisfactory.

The feedback provided by alumni highlights several areas of strength within the college, including curriculum relevance, teaching methodologies, and extracurricular activities. However, it also identifies areas for improvement, such as the need for enhanced practical learning opportunities and alumni engagement initiatives. The college will utilize this feedback to implement targeted strategies aimed at enriching the overall educational experience and fostering stronger alumni relationships. By continuously incorporating alumni input, the college reaffirms its commitment to excellence and student success.
