1.) Gujrat Industrial Visit



Date: 4th September 2024

Venue: Amul Factory, Anand; Amul Chocolate Factory;

Sardar Patel and Vithalbhai Vallabhbhai Patel Memorial; Shree Swaminarayan Mandir, Vadaldham

Number of Learners: 100 Students (50 male; 50 female)

Description:

The industrial visit to Gujarat provided students with an insightful experience of Amul's dairy and chocolate manufacturing processes. At the Amul factory in Anand, students learned about the cooperative's rich history and observed the production of various dairy products, including milk, butter, cheese, and ice cream. They gained key insights into dairy processing, automation, and stringent hygiene standards.

The visit continued to the Amul Chocolate Factory, where students witnessed the transformation of cocoa beans into finished chocolate products. The role of automation in ensuring quality, precision, and efficient packaging was a highlight. Beyond the industrial exposure, students explored Gujarat's cultural and historical heritage. They visited the Sardar Patel and Vithalbhai Vallabhbhai Patel Memorial, gaining a deeper appreciation for the leaders' contributions to India's freedom struggle. The journey concluded at Shree Swaminarayan Mandir, Vadaldham, where students experienced the temple's architectural beauty and spiritual ambiance, making the visit both educational and enriching.

2) BSE Seminar
